

A new entry and landscape heart




Image: Master plan for Manning Hospital redevelopment – Stage 2.

The NSW Government has committed \$100 million in Stage 2 of the Manning Hospital Redevelopment, with a total commitment of \$140 million for Stages 1 and 2.

- **Stage 2** of the redevelopment will deliver upgraded inpatient beds, access to telehealth spaces, and provide modern facilities to support contemporary models of care.
- **Stage 1** is complete and delivered enhanced cancer care services, renal dialysis services, medical imaging services, a hospital car park reconfiguration and an increased number of consultation spaces.



How to build a hospital

There are three distinct phases:


- planning

MASTER PLAN UNVEILED

The master plan for the hospital campus was unveiled in January 2022. The master plan is a high-level map of the hospital site which helps guide future growth and development of the facility. The master plan identifies the key elements of the hospital and how they best connect with each other.

Where are we now?

The project team is well underway into planning the Stage 2 of the redevelopment of Manning Base Hospital.

JUNE 2021	Lead project team announced, and the master planning process begins.
JULY - NOV 2021	Due diligence investigations including environmental, building and other technical studies undertaken as part of the master planning process.
	Consultation with staff and stakeholders gets underway supporting the development of the master plan for the site.
	Project User Groups (clinicians and support staff) established.
JANUARY 2022	Manning Hospital redevelopment - Stage 2 master plan unveiled.
	Connecting with Country engagement gets underway with a walk on country at Manning Base Hospital.
FEBRUARY	First information pop-up held for Manning Base Hospital staff.
WE ARE HERE	Concept design meetings, which explore how each department functions, completed.
AHEAD	Schematic design builds on the master plan and early-stage designs, determining the positioning and layout of each department within the hospital.
	Consultation with staff, stakeholders and community will continue.
	Detailed design is the final stage in the design phase. Detailed Design looks in close detail at room layouts, including the requirements and positioning of furniture, fixtures and equipment.
	The arts and history program will kick-off during this stage.
	As the designs and plans for the redevelopment progress, the project team will prepare the State Significant Development Application (SSDA), and Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the project.
	This is also the formal opportunity for community and stakeholders to have their say through the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE).
	Following the design phase and once planning approval has been obtained, a builder will be engaged for the construction works.
	The construction program will target local employment and Aboriginal participation.
